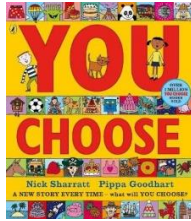


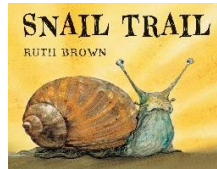
Parent Partnership

"You choose"



We have set up lots of learning activities that allow the children to choose 'who they want to be' and allow the children to make choices and ask lots of questions, we want them to use their imagination, have fun and inspire curiosity, and you can too.

We will also be reading this book...



The children are learning about prepositions, and as they have been fascinated with finding snails in the garden we thought this would be the perfect way to help them.

Help them learn at home

- Can you find some snails, they have beautiful shells, can you help your child draw the spiral shell and decorate or paint it.
- When playing with toys or teddies, can they put the teddy in front of the chair, behind the chair and next to the chair.
- Its time to dress up, if they were a princess or doctor, where would they work, what would they do? Encourage imaginative play, learn new vocabulary and answer all those questions they may have.
- We are also learning about 3D shapes, use the containers and boxes in your cupboard e.g. tins are cylinder shapes, cereal boxes are cuboids.
- Inspire a story, but a toy and some objects in a box, you can support your child to engage in a lovely imaginative adventure with their toy, e.g. The teddy can choose what object to pull out (a toy car) where will they go? Pull object out (some sun cream) are they going on holiday?
- Make a train using kitchen chairs, can the children make some tickets? Post-it notes are great for mark making.
- Tally charts are great for choosing and recording number marks, your child can draw 3 favourite items (teddy, car, rainbow) can they ask all the family members which one they like best and then 'tick' it.
 - When you go for a walk look at the shapes of the doors windows and wheels, environmental shapes are a great way to learn 2D shapes.
